

MINUTES OF BOARD OF INQUIRY HELD IN H.M.C.S. "NADEN" AT 1400, WEDNESDAY, 15th JULY, 1942, TO INQUIRE INTO THE DEATH OF ALLAN MORTON DAVIES, PETTY OFFICER WRITER (TEMPORARY), OFFICIAL NUMBER V.15145, ROYAL CANADIAN NAVAL VOLUNTEER RESERVE, AT LOST LAKE, HIGHLAND DISTRICT, NEAR VICTORIA, VANCOUVER ISLAND, BRITISH COLUMBIA, ON SUNDAY 12th JULY, 1942.

WITNESS: Captain R.M. Rice, R.C.A.M.C., Colwood, B.C. - CALLED.

- 1. Q. What is your name?
 - A. Captain R.M. Rice, R.C.A.M.C., Colwood, B.C.
- 2. Q. You are the Medical Officer who arrived at the scene of the accident, Sunday 12th July, 1942, in company with the representative of the Police Department.
 - A. Yes, sir.
- 3. Q. What time did you get there?
 - A. I arrived at 1330 on the scene of the accident, sir.
- 4. Q. Describe to us what you attributed this man's death to?
 - A. Death was attributed to drowning, sir.
- 5. Q. Was there any marks that might indicate this rating might have suffered death other than by drowning?
 - A. There was a sl-ight abrasion over the right eye which I doubt would have caused unconsciousness. His wife said he had come to the surface and had apparently been struggling and seemed in difficulties.
- 6. Q. Was there anything about this condition which might led you to believe that may have caused his death?
 - A. Nothing that I could see, sir. His throat was clear when I pulled his tongue out. His eyes were down. Rigor mortis had not set in when I examined him. The man was dead when I arrived.
- 7. Q. What was his appearance?
 - A. His appearance was that of a man who suffered drowning by suffocation. I injected 1 c.c. of Adrenaline into the patient's heart, with no response.

WITNESS: John Francis Campbell, Torpedo Coxswain, O.N. A.3061, R.C.N.R., H.M.C.S. "TIMMINS" - CALLED.

- 1. Q. What is your full name?
 - A. John Francis Campbell, Torpedo Coxswain, Official Number A.3061, Royal Canadian Naval Reserve?
- 2. Q. Where you the man who was called by the wife of Allan Morton Davies, Petty Officer Writer (Temporary), Official Number V.15145, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, when he was in trouble in the water?
 - A. I was the first there after the accident, sir.
- 3. Q. Will you relate to us what transpired then?
 - A. My wife and I were walking to this lake to go fishing and we were just about 300 yards from the lake and this car came down the road. The car stopped and this lady said her husband was drowning in Lost Lake. She then fell into a dead faint. I ran about 50 feet to my car and when I came back she had recovered and she showed me to the lake. I asked where he was and she pointed out that he had gone in the water here, so I took off my clothes. I swam out and looking down could see him about 40 feet from the shore and I dove down and got him up and to shore and gave him artificial respiration. Edward Milton Temple, Petty Officer, Official Number A.395, Royal Canadian Naval Reserve, arrived shortly and we continued this respiration. I arranged to have the police called and they came out. My watch stopped when I went into the water at 1245.
- 4. Q. Was there anybody else at the scene of the accident when you arrived there?
 - A. Nobody else there, sir.
- 5. Q. Nothing to indicate that this man was in charge of a number of ratings?
 - A. There was only Davies, his wife and a girl.
- 6. Q. Had be been wearing a Naval uniform?
 - A. I couldn't say as he had a bathing suit on, sir.
- 7. Q. Was there anything to indicate to you the time he was in the water from the time he started to have trouble till you pulled him out?
 - A. It must have been more than 10 minutes that he was under the w-ater. He was apparently dead when I got him out of the water as he showed no indication of reviving under respiration.
- 8. Q. He didn't show any sign of life, or no marks other than drowning?
 - A. There was no marks other than the mark above his eye. He might have got that when he dove into the water. There was about 10 feet of water. It must have been 15 minutes whem I received the call from his wife and I pulled him out of the water.

WITNESS: Edward Milton Temple, Petty Officer, O.N. A.395, H.M.C.S. "NADEN" - CALLED.

- 1. Q. What is your full name?
 - A. Edward Milton Temple, Petty Officer, Official Number A.395, Royal Canadian Naval Reserve.
- 2. Q. You were present after the drowning of Allan Morton Davies, Petty Officer Writer (Temporary), Official Number V.15145, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve?
 - A. Yes, sir.
- 3. Q. Would you tell us in your own words what part you took in this affair?
 - A. I was at a lake just across the road from Lost Lake and this lady came up and said a man had drowned. So she led me back to this lake and when I got there John Francis Campbell, Torpedo Coxswain, Official Number A.3061, Royal Canadian Naval Reserve, was applying artificial respiration to Davies. He had him out of the water and he was just about all in. We took charge of him till three civilians came along and we then took turns giving artificial respiration till the police arrived.
- 4. Q. Was there anything about Davies' body to indicate to you that he had an accident.
 - A. His head from the neck up was blue. He had no scars. He had a little abrasion over his eye. There was a big rock near the water and I think this caused the abrasion over his eye when he was brought ashore and turned face downwards and given artificial respiration. I don't think he was in uniform. There was a pair of wet Naval pants (round rig). I couldn't tell you if he had them on. There were three women there with with him.
- 5. Q. There were three women and Campbell with him?
 - A. Yes, sir.

WITNESS: Constable N.E. Asel, B.C. Police - CALLED.

- 1. Q. What is your name?
 - A. Constable N.E. Asel, B.C. Police.
- 2. Q. You were the first representative of the authorities to arrive at the scene of the accident?
 - A. Yes, sir.
- 3. Q. Would you describe to us the facts of the matter as you saw them?
 - A. Upon arriving at the scene I found the deceased on the lake shore and Campbell and Temple were applying artificial respiration.
- 4. Q. What time did you arrive?
 - A. I didn't note the time of arrival, but the minute that I saw the body had been recovered I sent Lockey to get a doctor and he returned shortly with Captain R.M. Rice, R.C.A.M.C. of Colwood, B.C. Shortly after he took over he suggested that we get aninhalator crew. By this time it was learned that the deceased was a member of the Navy. This was established by the fact that there was a pair of pants like ratings wear. I only found the pants, the other clothing I assumed were with his relatives and I gathered he must be a sailor from this piece of clothing. I sent Lockey to get in touch with H.M.C.S. "NADEN I" and get their inhalator crew. The crew arrived there 0310 and applied the pulmotor for some considerable time. Both doctors pronounced life extinct.
- 5. Q. Was there anything about Davies' body to indicate that he had met with some accident?
 - A. Nothing that I would personally suspect. There was a slight abrasion above the right eye that could have been caused when bringing him ashore. He was laying on a rock and in all probabilities it was caused from this.
- 6. Q. Where there any people there apart from Temple and Campbell, no one to indicate this man was in charge of a party?
 - A. No, sir. Davies car was there and the license number is 12297. It is a 1931 Chevrolet and registered under the name of Allan M. Davies, Oak Bay, B.C. Later a statement was obtained from Dorothy M. Davies, 268 Ontario Street, Victoria, B.C. She told me, "Davies, his wife, his wife's sister and herself left Victoria, B.C., and drove to the lake for a swim. Davies and his wife and Dorothy went in for a swim. Davies dove off the raft and when he came up shortly he appeared in difficulties as he was splashing a lot of water and cried out for his wife. His wife went to him and got hold of him and we tried to form a link around him by holding each other. Mrs. Pavies lost her hold on her husband and we went down and didn't come up. He could be seen on the bottom but we had no means of getting down to him. We got in the car and drove down the road and met Campbell. He rushed back and dove into the water, got the body and applied artificial respiration".

 - Surgeon Lieutenant J.W. Clark, R.C.N.V.R. (Temp.).
- You were the first Naval Medical Officer to arrive at the scene of the death? 2.
 - A. Yes, sir.
- Q. You arrived in response to a call from the B.C. Police requesting that you bring a Pulmotor?
 - I don't know who sent in the call as I was in the Wardroom but I went right out. We left here 1455 and arrived at the scene 1520. At that time Campbell was applying artificial respiration. At this time the patient was quite blue and was beginning to stiffen up. There was no pulse available, nor no signs of breathing. However, the pulmotor was started and artificial respiration was continued. The rectal sphincter was dilated and a second hypo of 1 c.c. of Adrenaline was injected by me into his heart, again without result.
- Was there anything to indicate he may have died from anthing else other than drowning?
 - He had a slight abrasion above his right eye. A.
- There was nothing to indicate he might have had some physical 5. Q. condition before he went swimming?
 - Nothing evident, sir. He was dead when we got there and my opinion is he died from drowning.

FINDING OF THE BOARD

In addition to hearing the evidence of such witnesses as were available, a transcript whereof is attached, the Board has discussed the matter of the death of the above-mentioned rating.

- The Board finds that Allan Morton Davies, Petty Officer Writer (Temporary), Official Number V.15145, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, came to his death on the 12th July, 1942, at or about 1230 hours by accidental drowning in Lost Lake, Highland District, near Victoria, Vancouver Island, British Columbia.
- In as much as this rating was not carrying out any Naval duty and was not on duty at the time of his death, but had gone swimming with his family for the purpose of personal entertainment, it is the opinion of the Board that the death of the deceased is in no way attributable to the Naval Service or to any connection thereto.


