I have on hand your letter of October 18th, in which you ask the above named person for:

Certificate of Character from some responsible person living in Usk.

I propose to deal with this matter at some length, and I, therefore, ask for your patient consideration of all that follows

On June 24th, 1935 I received a request from The Attorney General of British Columbia, that I act as Judge of The Juvenile Court for the trial of James Marvin Henderson and Harry Herbert H enderson.

The cases came up for hearing on July 16th, when the two youths were charged with Breaking and Entering. They pleaded "Guilty."

Before making any determination as to what should be done in the way of correction I took full statements from the youths, from Mrs Henderson, mother of the boys, and from J.Lee Bethurem, general merchants, whose store they had entered. I then adjuured adjourned the court, and made other enquiries and offered suggestions to the youths as to their conduct pending a final determination of the case.

The following are the facts secured.

Usk is a small village, the people chiefly being occupied with mining and railway work. No organised recreational facilities are available for the younger generation and they have been left to their own devices.

The two youths live with their mother, and with their two sisters who are younger than themselves. Mrs Henderson is a

widow, and has spent some years in The United States following 1136 the death of her husband. She, therefore, was not eligible for The Mother's Allowance when she returned to Canada.

A special allowance was made by the Government of British Columbia to enable her to keep the family together and take care of and bring up the children.

Mrs Henderson is an invalid, somewhat neurotic, and in her speech and actions very disjointed. Her home, which I have inspected, shows every sign of irresponsibility, and the children have grown up without anything that would suggest a planned course for the present or for the future.

Under these circumstances many things that the children have needed have not been forthcoming, and in my estimation the delinquencies have been largely due to this home condition.

The youths spoke freely in giving their statements. Harry who is the older one, stated that sometimes there was plenty of food in the house; at times there was little food. They had stolen food and clothing from the store so that they could eat in their room, and thus they would not eat so much when the meals were served. By this means, he said, they were able to have more food for the mother and sisters.

James spoke frankly of the means he had devised whereby they had entered the store - and left it again so that their entry would not be detected. His explanations showed that he had a distinct flair for mechanics.

Before adjourning Court I arranged for an apprisal of the food and goods stolen. The apprisal was made by Mr Bethurem, and Harry, who was working for the summer, agreed to pay the amount in instal/ments. Before his seasonal employment ended in the fall he had paid about half of the amount and in the final hearing of his case I placed him on probation until his 23rd birthday, and ordered that payment of the balance in instal/ments of \$15,00 a month be made from the time he becomes re-emplyed in the spring of 1936.

I may say frankly that in the case of James I was not so well satisfied.

He is a youth of more life than his brother, he could not get work to do and was greatly dissatisfied with his lot.

I planned to take the final hearing of his case on the same day I made the determination of the case of his brother.

My attitude was :

1. That, under the haphazard home conditions in which he lived he would be under the urge of his desire for some other outlet, and that as there seemed no way to satisfy it legitimately further trouble was to be expected.

and, if possible, to be in such a place where his ingenuity

mechanical flair, and adolescent energy could be moulded to his future good.

3. That only one way seemed to present itself - that of committing him to an Industrial School.

When the case came up I was informed that he had made application for enlistment in The Naval Service, and I, therefore, took a further adjournment pending the outcome of the application.

In doing so I felt that such an enlistment would be an ideal solution of the problem. That in your Service he would be under strict discipline, that in whatever branch he served he would find an outlet for his craving for mechanics, and that with the release from the drab round of life in a small village, close rimmed with mountains, he would find those conditions of life that would give him an outlet for the energy he possesses.

I drew these conclusions from my experiences while serving with The Canadian Forces during the years 1915 - 1919,

Your letter of October 18th has placed him in a difficult position. Naturally, no person in Usk, knowing the curcumstances can give him a clear recommendation.

He, therefore, wrote to Constable H.L.McKenney, B.C. Police, in charge of The Terrace Detachment. Constable McKenney has handled this case from it's inception.

Constable Mc^K enney took the matter up with me to-day, and it was agreed that the best course to pursue was for me to write you and state the facts.

Personally, I feel that the delinquency was, in the main, due to home surroundings, and lack of leadership in his formative years. I feel also, that he, with his brother, entered into the matter from a misguided idea of responsibility to his family - especially to his mother and sisters.

Natuarally I could not take the course of making a clear character statement on his behalf, but I would strongly urge that his case be given a careful, and, in so far as possible, a sympathetic consideration.

If you can see your way clear to accept him in The Naval Service I can assure you that no difficulties will be placed in his way in The Juvenile Court.

I feel that he has learned his lesson during the past months, and that he would prove amendable to discipline, and anxious to do all things in his power to prove worthy of the confidence reposed in him.

I am most anxious, if possible, to avoid committing him to an Industrial School. I feel that such an atmosphere would not be the best one for him. That, while it appeared to be the

only alternative, still it was far from being the best for his future.

But I do feel that in The N aval Service of Canada he would have every chance to make good, and definitely place behind him the error into which he has fallen.

1136

In conclusion: I can quite appreciate the desirability of securing recruits of good character. But may I quote the Juvenule Delinquents Act. Section 33, in part, says "Every Juvenile Delinquant shall be treated not so much as a criminal, but as a misdirected and misguided child, and one needing aid, encouragement, help and assistance."

Therefore, I would again urge as sympathetic consideration of this application as it is allowable to give so that what appears to be a happy outcome of the problem may be reached and the lad given a chance to re-establish himself in the eyes of all.

I am directed to acknowledge your letter of the 18th November regarding the application of James Marvin Henderson, candidate for entry into The Royal Canadian Navy as a Boy (Seaman Class.)

Taking for granted that you are desirous of having an immediate solution of the problem regarding the above mentioned candidate, I wish to state that in view of the large number of applicants on the Recryiting Roster, and the extremely small number of vacancies anticipated in The Royal Canadian Navy, no definite promise can be given as to when it will be possible to effect the entry of new candidates.

If, in view of the above conditions, Mr Henderson's name is placed on the Recruiting Roster for entry in any capacity, he would in all probability have to wait several years before his name would be reached, and his name is not, therefore, heing placed on The Recruiting Roster.

Your will understand that no exception can be made in the case of Mr H enderson's entry in the Royal Canadian Navy, as this would be manifestly unfair to applicants of the highest character whose names have, many of them, been on the Recruiting Roster for several years.

I regret that such is the case but under the circumstances there is nothing I can do to further Mr Henderson's entry in The Royal Canadian Navy.

Dear Sir,

Thank you for your very full explanation of the situation with reference to the application of James Marvin Henderson for Enlistment in The Royal Canadian Navy as a Boy, (Seaman Class.)

As a result of receiving your letter I made a trip to Usk on the 9th, and yesterday held a final hearing and determination of the case.

I was pleased to find that a very definite interest in the lad's welfafe was shown by some of the young men of the community, and that they seemed anxious that he be allowed to remain at home. Under that condition they were prepared to do all they could for his future guidance.

The information contained in your letter came as a heavy blow to the lad - he, evidently, had built great hopes on enlisting.

My decision was as follows :

1 That he be placed on probation until October 24th, 1942 - his 23rd birthday.

2. That he report to the B.C. Police at Terrace B.C., at any time he plans to chagge his address.

3. That he recommence his studies of Mechanical Drawing under The Extension Branch of The British Columbia Department of Education.

I was very pleased to note in your letter that you did not refuse to place his name on The Recruiting Roster, but refrained from so doing owing to my evident desire to have an immediate settlement of the matter, and in view of the years that will most probably elapse before his name will be reached.

In view of the determination I have made in his case these considerations no longer apply, and I should greatly appreciate his name being placed on the Roster if you can see your way clear to have it so entered.

I may say frankly that in all probability by such a time comes as he will be called for he - like many other youths - will

have found his nixche in life elsewhere.

But I do feel that if you place his name on the Roster it will do much to strengthen his morale, it will give him the feeling of having something definite to look forward to, and that he can still take his place with other lads of his age.

I quite appreciate your stand that nothing can be done to give the lad preference. That, as you say, would be manifestly unfair.

But I do feel that such an action as I have suggested will do much along the lines in which I am most interested - of placing him in a position where he can put behind him the mistakes of his past, and go on to develop into a good citizen of our Dominion.

When your name is reached, instructions regarding your provisional medical examination will be forwarded to you. Pending receipt of these instructions you should keep the Department advised of any change of address.



With reference to your letter of the 10th March, 1941 concerning the late James Marvin Henderson, Signalman, R.C.N., O.N. 2939, the following remarks on the history of his Service in the Royal Canadian Navy are forwarded for your information.

During the whole time this rating served he was not punished for any serious disciplinary offence. His character assessment from date of entry to the time of his death was "Very Good", and his efficiency as a Signalman was rated from "Satisfactory" as a Boy Seaman to "Superior" as a Signalman to the time he was lost. Henderson served in H.M.C. Establishments on the West and East Coasts, attended courses at the Royal Naval Barracks, Portsmouth, served in H.M.S. "DANAE". At the outbreak of war, he was serving in H.M.C.S. "FRASER". Following the unfortunate loss of this vessel, he was drafted to H.M.C.S. "MARGAREE" and was one of the 143 casualties sustained when this ship was sunk by collision while escorting a convoy.

From this record, it will be seen that
Henderson turned out to be a good average rating, and
it is felt that the faith you put in him was not misplaced. It is suggested that should you wish for more

Dear Madam: It is with deep regret that I must confirm the telegram sent out by the Minister of National Defence, reporting that your son, James Marin Henderson, Signalman, O.N. 2939, R.C.N., was missing, believed killed. Few details are available, but it is known that H.M.C.S. "MARGAREE" was sunk in collision in the North Atlantic whilst steaming without lights, on convoy duty, and in the submarine zone. 142 Officers and ratings are missing and must be presumed lost at sea. I am requested to express to you the sincere sympathy of the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services and the Chief of the Naval Staff in your bereavement.
